ISESS 2020: Data Science in Action, (2nd Call for Papers; <http://www.issess.net>; the submission deadline of 4 October will be extended) 13th International Symposium on Environmental Software Systems, **Wageningen, Netherlands, February 5-7, 2020**. ISESS 2020 aims to serve as a forum to present primary research in data science and applications in the environmental and green life sciences. Recent advances in the field that demonstrate experiences with artificial intelligence, big data, IoT, cloud, virtualisation or parallel computing and how these transform environmental modelling and software practice. Application domains include a broad range of environmental sciences and applications, including environmental monitoring, marine, geosciences, climate change, hydrology, agriculture, breeding, emergency/crises management, bioinformatics (i.e. plant and animal genetics), food, nutrition and health research. Particularly welcome are applications in digital humanities and applications with relations to sustainable development goals. Accepted papers will be published with Springer as chapters in volume 554 of IFIP Advances in Information and Communication Technology series. We invite two types of papers: Full Papers are expected to be 8-12 pages; Short Papers are expected to be 4-6 pages.
