## 4 President's report

The President gave a short verbal report. One of the highlights of the year being the **50**<sup>th</sup> **Anniversary celebrations** in May when members gathered in various locations around Australia and China to celebrate together.

### MODSIM2025

- Paper submissions and full papers: The Chair shared an update on the status of MODSIM 2025 paper submissions, noting a reduction in full paper submissions but reiterating the importance of retaining full papers for the community. Over 100 full papers were submitted last year, highlighting the need to maintain this option.
- **Potential new partner**: The APSIM (Agricultural Production Systems Simulator) Initiative has expressed interest in partnering with MODSIM 2025, to include a workshop the weekend prior to MODSIM and a dedicated session in the Biological Systems stream for presentations.

### **MEMBERS**

- **Stream leadership changes:** The AGM acknowledged the contributions of those long-serving MODSIM stream leaders who have stood down this year, and welcomed the new stream leaders.
  - Retiring leaders are Malcolm McPhee (Biological systems), Behzad Rismanchi (Energy, integrated infrastructure and urban planning), Christoph Rudiger (Global change and natural hazards), Louise Freebairn (Health and biosecurity) and Melanie Ayre (ASOR) due to retirement or other reasons. The Chair thanked the outgoing stream leaders for their contributions.
  - New Stream leaders are Hazel Parry (Biological systems), Linh Ho and Felix Chan (Economics and finance), Lui Cirocco (Energy, integrated infrastructure and urban planning), Jason Sharples (Global change and natural hazards), Jens Froese (Health and biosecurity) and Hasan Turan (ASOR).
    - ACTION: The Chair proposed including a special acknowledgment of these individuals in the upcoming newsletter
    - **ACTION:** President to write to retiring and incoming Stream Leaders thanking them for their service to the Society.

Volunteer recognition: The AGM recognised the importance of maintaining a volunteer-based culture within the Society. The President took the opportunity to thank the members of the Management Committee and Awards Committee for their hard work. He also welcomed Ivy Miao as our new Executive Officer, replacing Karen Mobbs who had supported the Society since MODSIM2005.

### **MENTORING**

The meeting discussed the proposal for MODSIM2025 (and the Society in general) of setting up Mentoring arrangement (informal). Especially encourage Fellows to mentor younger and/or new members, specially at MODSIM congresses.

# 5 Treasurer's report

- The Treasurer Georgy Sofronov reported that the society continues to be in good financial health. The net result from MODSIM2023 was a positive balance, 100% due to the financial incentive the Society received from the Northern Territory government for bringing people to the Territory. This indicates the critical role that sponsors play in managing the financial aspects of the conference.
